2023 MWHS Accomplishments

Membership

Membership grew from 135 in 2021 to 199. During our 2021 fundraising effort, we gave all non-member donors a year of free membership, thereby artificially elevating "membership" to 252 in 2022. At the end of 2023, our paid membership stands at 199, up 47% from the end of 2021.

At an Open House for volunteers, we engaged 14 new volunteers to share their talents in supporting our mission.

Leadership

We are one year into implementing a new strategic plan focused on four key objectives:

- 1) Identify and increase the collection of history at risk: people and places
- 2) Populate the website based on the most compelling information
- 3) Increase engagement with our YouTube Channel
- 4) Increase the number of volunteers and their involvement in committees

We will be addressing new strategic objectives in 2024.

Jim Bokern attended the Wisconsin State Historical Society Local History Conference in October and presented on Clio and the Northern Wisconsin Heritage Council.

We recognized Tom and Michele Baer and the Koller Library staff (Janelle Kohl, Sarah Krembs and Callie Bates) with the MWHS award for Leaders of Historical Preservation.

Jim Bokern received the Fixmer Award from the Forest History Association of Wisconsin.

Fundraising

We raised \$53,588 in 2021 for historic digital archiving preservation. We have spent \$42,867 to help us achieve our strategic objectives, particularly numbers 2 and 3 listed above, leaving us with \$10,721. Once these funds are exhausted, we will use subsequent donations to continue our efforts.
